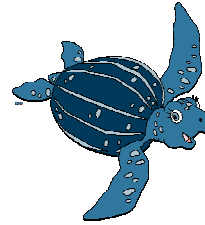

Policies

Absences

When a student is absent from school they are responsible for asking about missed work. They need to also ask if anything was handed in when they were absent. For each day absent students have two days to make-up the work. However, the sooner they can get caught up the better.

Homework

Students will be receiving homework almost every night. It is a vital part of the educational process. Therefore, all assignments should be completed and turned in on time.

Missed Assignments

If for some reason a student misses a homework assignment, they will be "ZAPped". ZAP stands for Zeros Aren't Permitted. Students who are "ZAPped" will receive a lunch detention for the next day where they will complete the assignment and the work will receive full credit. If a student fails to attend lunch detention, the assignment will no longer be accepted for full credit. Credit given varies according to subject area and individual teacher policies. Also, long term assignments do not follow this policy. If a student is "ZAPped" for poor quality of work (under 70%), the student will also receive a lunch detention for the next day and will be required to improve the quality of the work submitted. Students attending lunch detention will be permitted to return to lunch when the work is completed to satisfaction. Parents and students will be notified of a "ZAP" by a sticker in the student planner. Students who repeatedly fail to attend lunch detention when assigned will be given a discipline referral.
