Required Materials

A binder that is only used for math., pencils, a calculator (preferably TI-30), a combination ruler/protractor, notebook paper and graph paper.

Course Schedule

Areas of study include: Equations and Inequalities, Geometry, Functions and Graphs, Ratio and Proportion, and Probability and Statistics, all with an emphasis on problem solving, analysis, and preparation for the OAT.

Classroom Expectations (The 4 B's)

1. Be on time.
2. Be prepared.

Homework

I usually assign homework every day, except the night before and after a major test. I try to allow at least 10 minutes of class to start the assignment. Students may ask questions during class the next day. I grade homework on completion and following directions, not how many right or wrong. Assignments are written on the board and should be copied into the planners. Assignments are posted weekly on Progress Book. Homework is about 25% of your grade.

Late Assignments:

I will accept late work the next day for partial credit.

Tests

Tests are scheduled every two to three weeks. I announce tests about a week in advance. Students will receive a review worksheet two days before the test. Tests are returned within two to three days. Tests are about 65% of your grade.

Quizzes

Quizzes are announced two to three days in advance. Students will be told what types of questions are on the quiz. Quizzes are about 5 % of your grade.

Group Projects

Students will occasionally work on an assignment in a group. Each student will be responsible for their own work. Their grade will be based on completing their work not what other students do. Projects are about 5 % of your grade.

Grading Scale:

The grading scale will follow that of the district.
